



SIMPLE PRESENT PASSIVE VOICE

Apple Inc. **makes** iPhone.
iPhone **is made** by Apple Inc.

Brazil grows more oranges and coffee than the other countries.
More oranges and coffee **are grown** in Brazil than in the other countries.

SIMPLE PAST PASSIVE VOICE

Juscelino Kubitschek built Brasilia.
Brasilia was built by JK.

The Egyptians invented mirrors.
Mirrors were invented by the Egyptians.





Malcolm X, a.k.a. El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz, was a black American **activist / activism** who had a lasting impact on race relations in America. His speeches and political work helped bring to the world's attention the evil of **racist / racism** in the USA. He led an extraordinary life that would take him from poverty, crime and prison to being a **much / many** respected community leader.

He was born Malcolm Little in 1925 but **rejected / rejection** his surname later in life because it represented his slavery past. He adopted 'X' to signify his unknown **ancestry / family**. Malcolm was top of his class at junior high school and wanted to be a lawyer. A teacher told him he was the wrong color to study law and he dropped out of high school.

He moved to New York in 1943 and **slowly / slowed** became involved in drug dealing, gambling, robbery and other crimes. In 1946, he was sent to prison for ten years. He became an avid **reading / reader** and educated himself in many topics. He also converted to Islam and met leaders of the Nation of Islam and the Black Muslims. He left prison in 1952.

In 1954, Malcolm X became **leader / leadership** of a Nation of Islam temple in New York. He became well known for his **political / politics** views and regularly appeared on TV and in newspapers. He became famous around the world. In 1964, Malcolm X made his pilgrimage to Mecca, where he realized all races were the same. Malcolm X was assassinated while making a speech in 1965.

Of course, Lady Gaga isn't her **really / real** name. She was born Stefani Joanne Angelina Germanotta on March the 28th, 1986. Lady Gaga is her **stage / staging** name. She is an American singer-songwriter who has become one of the biggest names in music – for her songs, performances, fashion and **political / politics**. She became famous in 2008 and just two years later was included in Time magazine's list of the 100 most influential / influence people in the world.

Lady Gaga had a **musical / musically** upbringing. She learned to play the piano from the age of four and was singing in public by the time she was 14. She also loved acting in musicals at school. She went to a New York **art / drama** college at the age of 17 where she wrote a research magazine paper that focused on "music, art, sex and celebrity". She concentrated on songwriting and singing in New York clubs. She got her name from the Queen song "Radio Gaga".

Gaga was **inspired / inspirational** by David Bowie, Blondie and Madonna. She hit the big time following the release of her debut album The Fame in 2008. The singles "Just Dance" and "Poker Face" became international **hit / hits**. The album reached number one on the record charts in six countries. Her second album Born This Way (2011) also enjoyed spectacular success. The single "Born This Way" was the **fast / fastest-selling** single in iTunes history.

Gaga is also outspoken when it **comes / goes** to politics. She has spoken at military meetings in support of gays and lesbians in the US Army and shocked the world by wearing a dress made from meat, to draw attention to human rights. She is also a philanthropist and **raised / increased** \$500,000 for the Haiti earthquake from a concert performance. Gaga also **designed / designs** a Japan Prayer Bracelet which raised \$1.5 million for Japan's tsunami relief **fund / funding**.




