



COMPARING GRAMMAR: WILL VS GOING TO

WILL **GOING TO Instant Decision Prior Plan** - I'm thirsty. I think I will buy a drink. = The decision was made before the moment of speaking. Offer - They're going to get married - That looks heavy, I will help you with it. next year. **Promise** Evidence / Signs Don't worry, I won't tell anyone. = When there are signs that something is likely to happen. If you don't stop, I will tell your mother. - I don't feel well. I think I am Refusal won't = will not going to throw up. She won't listen to anything I say. It's 70-0. They're going to win.

You can use both **Will** and **Going to** for making predictions.

- I think it will rain tomorrow. = - I think it is going to rain tomorrow.

COMPARE: Are you busy this evening?

- I haven't made any plans.
I think I **will** probably watch TV.
I'm probably **going to** watch TV.

Will and **going to** are both possible here. We are "predicting" what will happen because nothing is planned.

- Yes, I'm **going to** visit my parents.

Only **Going to** is possible because this is a prior plan.

In spoken English **Going to** is often pronounced as "**gonna**"

Using the present continuous to talk about the future

The present continuous is used to talk about **arrangements** for events at a time later than now. There is a suggestion that more than one person is aware of the event, and that some preparation has already happened.

Examples:

- I'm meeting Jim at the airport = Jim and I have discussed this.
- I am leaving tomorrow. = I've already bought my train ticket.
- We're having a staff meeting next Monday = all members of staff have been told about it.

More Examples: Is she seeing him tomorrow?

He isn't working next week.

They aren't leaving until the end of next year.

We are staying with friends when we get to Boston.

Taxi Drivers
